The Eucharistic Miracles of The World & Relic of Blessed Carlo Acutís

This exhibit was designed and created by Blessed Carlo Acutís. Over the course of three years, he catalogued the world's Eucharistic miracles. A self-taught computer programmer, he was attracted to social communication and utilized this medium to help people discover that God is close to us and that it is beautiful to be with him and enjoy his friendship and grace.

As a young child, Blessed Acutís had his gaze turned to Jesus and his love for the Eucharist was the foundation that kept his relationship with God. When he was diagnosed with leukemia, he offered his suffering for the pope and the Church. He died at the age of 15. Blessed Carlo Acutís is the first millennial to be beatified (October 10, 2020) by the Catholic Church and is now one step away from canonization.
