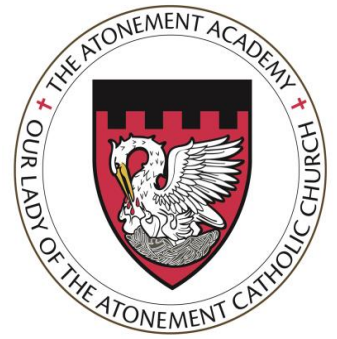


# Our Lady of The Atonement Catholic Church

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Chair of St. Peter is about to receive its long awaited publication of the Divine Worship: Divine Office. This book will serve in place of the Liturgy of the Hours for members of The Chair of St. Peter.

It had long been an Anglican Patrimony that the main two offices, namely that of Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer be recited in the Church, by clergy and laity alike. Now that we will be receiving our official book for these prayers and with the encouragement of our Bishop, it is expected that Ordinariate communities establish Morning and Evening prayer as part of their public devotions.

Where do we fit these liturgies into our already existing Mass schedule? This past Saturday, I consulted with our clergy and members of our Instituted Acolytes to discuss and review our options. It seemed most reasonable that Morning and Evening Prayer should take place every day prior to the 7:00 AM and 5:00 PM (when applicable) Masses respectively. To accomplish this, it was suggested we have a uniform, consistent Mass schedule that Morning and Evening Prayer would complement.

After much discussion, I have decided to implement the following schedule at the beginning of Advent, the weekend of November 28<sup>th</sup>. Please note the bold type represents the amended schedule.
